C. H. S. A. A. TITLE GOES TO POWER MEMORIAL

Gorman Blanks St. Augustine's Nine, 4 to 0, in City Final at Polo Grounds

Behind a three-hit pitching performance by Tom Gorman, the Power Memorial Academy baseball team blanked St. Augustine's High of Brooklyn, 4 to 0, at the Polo Grounds yesterday to win the city Catholic High Schools Athletic Association championship.

A double by bespectacled Clarence Squibb that scored three of his teammates in the seventh and final inning settled the issue after the victors had bagged their initial run in the sixth. The triumph for one of the youngest members in the C. H. S. A. A. circuit gave Power its first all-city crown in association competition.

Gorman himself accounted for the Manhattan school's first counter. He led off in the sixth with a single, stole second with one out and then pilfered third with two down. Tim Brosnan, St. Augustine's catcher, threw the ball past Third Baseman Al Baker in trying to catch Gorman on the latter steal and the Power pitcher crossed the plate.
